

3 watercolour art ideas for kids

INSPIRATION STATION

Let's look at 3 different techniques you can use with your kids for watercolour art painting. These are lots of fun, plus you'll create art that you'll want to keep and put on display! Keep reading to learn how...

supplies

- Jovi Watercolour Art Pack
- Reeves Watercolour Pad
- Reeves Watercolour brushes
- Winsor and Newton Masking Fluid
- Salt
- Water



1. Resist Technique:

This is super fun and quite entrancing for the kids to try! First, draw designs on paper with the Art Masking Fluid. Let that dry, then the kids can paint all over the paper. When the paint is completely dry, peel off the art masking fluid. You'll be amazed how it reveals your design in crisp, contrasting white paper!



2. Water Technique:

Wet the paper thoroughly. Then let the kids add as much paint as they like. The paint and water create a lovely effect which is quite abstract.



3. Salt Technique:

Get the kids to paint the paper, with quite a lot of water. Then they can sprinkle salt over the wet areas, creating interesting effects as the salt absorbs the water.

Tip: Try to leave some white space on the paper, or finish each piece before the kids have completely drowned it in paint. This will help create pieces that look appealing and you'll want to keep!
