Tip before you start

1. Please check that all parts are present before you start the assembly of your furniture.
2. For ease and speed of assembly, we recommend that before you commence each step of the assembly, that you identify all the parts required for that step.
3. For larger items, please ensure that you have sufficient space and people (as indicated on page 1) to assemble your product safely.
4. We recommend that, where possible, all items are assembled near to the area in which they will be placed in use, to avoid moving the product unnecessarily once assembled.
5. For the protection of your furniture, we recommend that the product is placed on a protected surface during assembly to prevent any damage.
6. During assembly please take care not to over-tighten any fittings, as this may damage the product. Do not use power tools.
7. Always place the product on a flat, steady and stable surface.
8. Do not stand on the product. Do not use the product as a stepladder.
9. This product is intended household use only as it is a non-industrial product.
10. Please use caution and care when lifting the product to avoid personal injury and/or product damage.

HARDWOOD CARE INSTRUCTIONS







- Hardwood timber is extremely tough & durable but will naturally react to the elements. Fading to a silvery grey, checking and hairline cracks may occur. Furniture requires very little maintenance as it has been made to be used throughout the year in all types of weather conditions.
- If the finish becomes dirty, greasy or oily, Wood Cleaner is recommended for easy removal. High-pressure water cleaners should not be used to clean your furniture.
- It is quite natural for timber to shrink and expand depending on humidity levels. We recommend storing furniture under cover, out of direct sunlight and using furniture covers when not in use and for protection during the winter months. Do not store this product in centrally heated rooms, as this will cause the timber to dry out and possibly shrink and crack.

PLASTIC CARE INSTRUCTIONS

- Plastic furniture uses both Polypropylene and fibre glass reinforced Polypropylene that is injected into moulds to create furniture that is extremely durable and hard-wearing with UV resistance. All Plastics are tested to high standards for restricted substances and carry no harmful chemicals or additives.
- All plastics are fully recyclable. Each piece of plastic can be recycled without producing waste or damaging the environment. Plastic outdoor furniture requires little or no maintenance. Soap and water is sufficient to clean, but should it become dirty, greasy or oily, we recommend that you use Plastic Cleaner for easy removal.

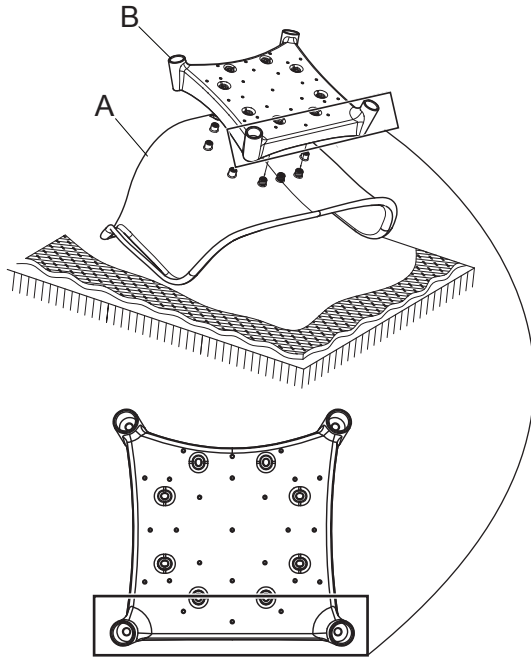
